When the Church Speaks What does it mean and what can we do? A Look at our Social Principles

Since its first Social Creed in 1908 the Methodist Church has taken positions on social and political issues relevant to the current time. These positions are grounded in our faith and rooted in scripture. Our current Social Principles cover a variety of subjects including food safety, bullying, pornography, rights of immigrants, mental health,

poverty, graft and corruption, the death penalty, war and peace and much more. Our series on the Social Principles will scratch the surface of these topics while also delving deeper into the values system and dialogue that leads to the development of these principles for our global church.

In our first session we will explore **The Natural World**. Our Social Principles tell us that "All creation is the Lord's, and we are responsible for the ways in which we use and abuse it. Economic, political, social, and technological developments have increased our human numbers, and lengthened and enriched our lives. However, these developments have led to regional defoliation, dramatic extinction of species, massive human suffering, overpopulation, and misuse and overconsumption of natural and nonrenewable resources, particularly by industrialized societies. This continued course of action jeopardizes the natural heritage that God has entrusted to all generations."

"Water, air, soil, minerals, energy resources, plants, animal life, and space are to be valued and conserved because they are God's creation and not solely because they are useful to human beings." Categories for Social Principles: Natural World include:

Water, Air, Soil, Minerals, Plants tells us that: "We support and encourage social policies that serve to reduce and control the creation of industrial byproducts and waste; facilitate the safe processing and disposal of toxic and nuclear waste and move toward the elimination of both; encourage reduction of municipal waste; provide for appropriate recycling and disposal of municipal waste; and assist the cleanup of polluted air, water, and soil."

<u>Energy Resources Utilization</u> tells us that: "The whole earth is God's good creation and as such has inherent value. We are aware that the current utilization of energy resources threatens this creation at its very foundation. As members of The United Methodist Church we are committed to approaching creation, energy production, and especially creation's resources in a responsible, careful and economic way."

<u>Animal Life</u> tells us that: "We support regulations that protect and conserve the life and health of animals, including those ensuring the humane treatment of pets, domesticated animals, animals used in research, wildlife, and the painless slaughtering of meat animals, fish, and fowl."


