In the midst of these grand gestures, it is tempting to paint Zacchaeus as a hero. The true hero of the story is Jesus. By seeing Zacchaeus in the tree, calling out to him, and even visiting his home, Jesus makes a bold statement! God's love is extended to everyone, even those despised by society, even to tax collectors.

Dive Deeper Together

Read Luke 19:1-10 together in the Deep Blue Kids Bible.

OR

Read "Zacchaeus": Jesus was out one day walking through the city of Jericho. Zacchaeus, a local tax collector, wanted to see Jesus but could not see over the crowd because he was too short. Zacchaeus climbed up a nearby tree so that he could see Jesus. Jesus approached the tree that Zacchaeus was in and said, "Zacchaeus, come down. I must stay at your home today." Zacchaeus climbed down and took Jesus to his home. Tax collectors were known for being unfair, so the crowd was unhappy that Jesus would choose to stay with a tax collector. Zacchaeus heard what the crowd was saying about him, and because Zacchaeus was a good and faithful man he promised to give half of all that he owned to the poor and to be fair to everyone in his tax collecting. Jesus loved and believed Zacchaeus. Because of his faithfulness Jesus told Zacchaeus, "Today you have been saved."
